

We are glad you are with us today.

We are a family of faith living and growing together in Christ.

This bulletin is filled with information about the life of the church, you are invited to take it home for reference and further reflection during the week. 



11:00 PM - Candlelight Communion Service with Special music plus Adult & Bell Choirs.


The Christmas ORCHESTRA is BACK!!






