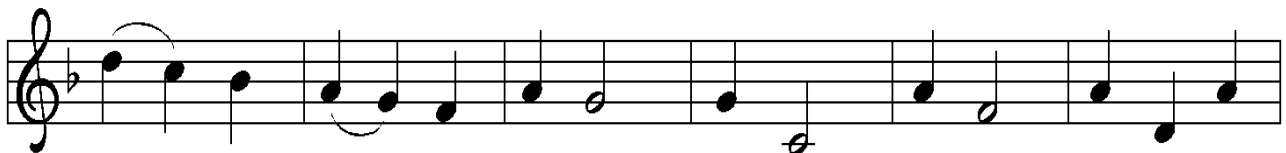

Acts 10:34-43



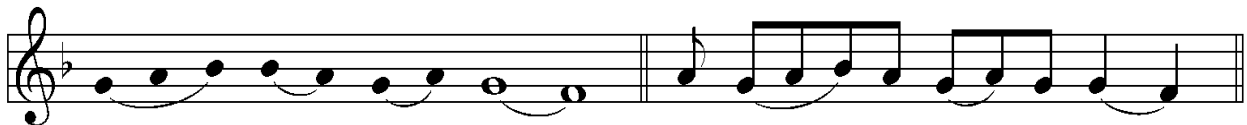


