# A Note from Our Pastor

#### Dear Friends in Christ:

After a rousing Easter Sunday with services filled with Alleluia's and praise for our risen Savior, I left church and arrived at my home, and what to my surprise did I see, the bush in front of our house had suddenly gone into full bloom. The cool spring had prevented much color from blossoming in our neighborhood even though our yards had all become quite green. But here was this dormant bush, that must have known that it was Easter, because suddenly its beautiful lavender flowers had bloomed for all the world to see. It was as if the flowers were sealed up inside of a tomb but now had risen to new life. It's fascinating when such coincidences happen, when a simple sign in nature reminds us of what's really important or points us to some new revelation.

The Bible doesn't mention butterflies, but for many they are living embodiments of endurance, transformation, and resurrection. Many have compared the resurrection of Jesus Christ to the evolution of a butterfly as the caterpillar disappears once it forms a chrysalis. And it is gone just as Jesus was, when he was crucified on the cross and placed in a tomb. The caterpillar is then resurrected to new life as a butterfly with all its beautiful colors, and Jesus, too, was resurrected and emerged as the powerful savior of all people.

Rebirth to new life is a central concept in all of Christianity, just as in baptism we die to our past selves and are reborn to new life with the promises of forgiveness of our sins and eternal life.

James Agee wrote a beautiful novel several years ago entitled, "A Death in the Family." The story is told from the delicate perspective of a little boy whose father was killed in an automobile accident. Agee tells about the bewilderment of that boy and his struggle to understand this awful ending. There is a lot of tone and texture to the story. The smell of funeral flowers and the solemn calling of friends, all in the home of the boy, which was a Southern tradition before there were professional funeral homes. The story ends with the boy attending his father's funeral.

As the service comes to an end, the boy witnesses a miracle. A beautiful butterfly slowly flies into the open grave and lights softly upon the casket. The wings beat once. Twice. There is perfect harmony with the silence of the moment. And then, as gently as it entered the earthy grave, it flies off into the sky. What a beautiful symbol of new life! What was an ending, became a beginning.

I recently read that in the Nazi concentration camps where children were kept before they were taken to the gas chamber, the walls hold the artistic scratchings and drawings of those children. The one motif that was found over and over was that of the butterfly. Isn't that remarkable? A symbol of resurrection in the midst of one

worst crucifixions.

As we celebrate this season of Easter and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus, let's embrace all those surprising signs and little reminders



that we often encounter, that remind us that our God is a God of new beginnings and new life. Christ is Risen! And that means new possibilities exist that we may have never imagined as possible. May your new beginnings and new life take flight as simply and effortlessly as a butterfly, and have a wonderfilled Easter season!

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on April 14th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$41,194 (YTD \$124,680). Operating expenses were \$38,895 (YTD \$114,606). The mortgage balance is now \$446,606

**Pastor's Report:** We celebrated First Communion on March 16th. We are still looking for delegates for the Synod Assembly on May 30–31. Pastor hosted training on March 23<sup>rd</sup> and March 30<sup>th</sup> for assisting minister and altar guild.

**Christian Education**: The Children's Stations of the Cross event took place the Saturday before Easter. May 18th will be the last Sunday School class for the school year. Tuesday LYFE will wrap up on May 13th and Confirmation Sunday is May 4th.

**Fellowship:** Thank you to Ryan Hathaway and Corey Kalas for making a fabulous Corned Beef and Cabbage! Attendees enjoyed food, fellowship and songs. More fun was had on April 11th at Prairie View Tavern for a fish fry! Be on the lookout for more events.

**Property:** The April workday was very productive thanks to the large, enthusiastic turnout! Spring HVAC maintenance was completed on April 11th. A pulley in Roof Top Unit #2 failed, causing severe wear on the shaft and required replacement of the blower motor.

**Worship and Music:** Everyone enjoyed music from all the choirs on Easter Sunday! Communion Deacons are needed!

**Existing Business:** Work on the sanctuary floor will begin on May 23rd. After services on May 18th, we will need help to remove everything from the sanctuary that isn't tied down!

Adult Choir — Regular Adult choir rehearsal times are as follows: Wednesday evenings at 7:15 PM. Sunday mornings from 8:30.


**Bell Choir** — Rehearsals are Wednesday evenings at 6:15pm and alternating Sundays.
