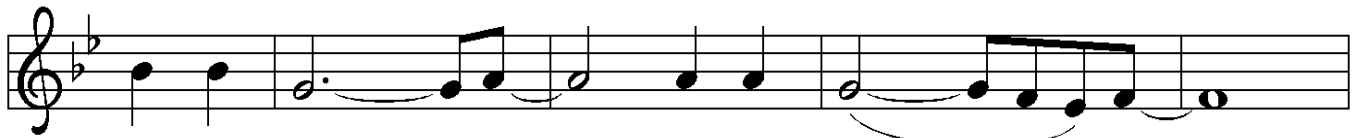

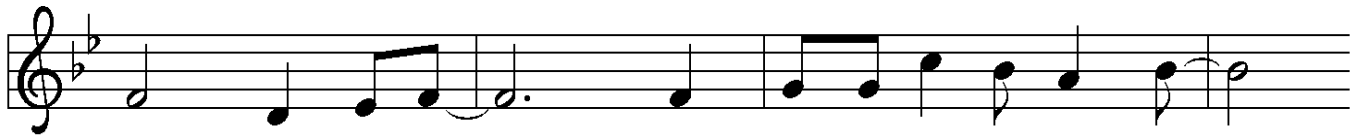

FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-21

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.



SOUND SYSTEM APPEAL — Many of you are aware that our sound system is outdated, and broken. We have been exploring different vendors to replace it and are preparing to have the work done, but we need to raise nearly \$20,000 in order to make this happen. Our endowment fund will be covering the remainder of the cost. Our goal is to raise \$20,000 by Music Sunday, which is June 2nd. We are asking everyone to consider what they can contribute toward this goal. An envelope donation wall is set up in the gathering space.

IMPORTANT TAX BENEFIT— Members of our congregation who are fortunate enough to have reached that golden IRS age of 70 ½ can donate directly to Holy Spirit from your taxable IRA. If you direct your IRA custodian to distribute via direct check to Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit you will not be paying taxes to Uncle Sam on that dollar amount. This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This direct contribution also satisfies any Required Minimum Distribution you may be subject to. This distribution is not included in your Adjusted Gross Income for the year and thus will not be taxable income, nor will this amount count against your IRMAA (income related monthly adjustment amount for Medicare). You may already have a checkbook for your taxable IRA account for making such charitable contributions written directly to the charity. Currently the maximum annual QCD amount any individual can make in total is \$105,000 (index adjusted annually). Also note for those who must take a RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) from a taxable IRA, this amount given to a charitable organization is applicable towards your RMD.
