On Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 1963, the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit was officially organized as a congregation of the newly formed Lutheran Church in America.

A Note from Our Pastor

Dear friends in Christ,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! What a wonderful celebration of Christ's resurrection we had this past Easter Sunday! It was wonderful to have so many gathered to celebrate the victory of our God with triumphant music and shouts of praise, as we all gathered to receive Christ's presence at the communion table. And the new life we receive through Christ's resurrection will continue to be celebrated in the month of May as we celebrate through baptism, the affirmation of our faith in confirmation, and as we celebrate the 6oth anniversary of our congregation.

When Jesus appeared to his disciples and many of his other followers after His resurrection, he not only demonstrated the power of God and defeated death and the devil for all time, he also "opened the minds" of his followers to understand their mission. That's why the early church never understood Jesus' departure from them, when he ascended into heaven, with a sense of loss or abandonment. Rather, it was seen as a further step toward His glorification and did not mean that Jesus was no longer with them. And we are challenged to be bold in our actions of love and service, "For the Spirit, God gave us, does not make us timid, but gives us power, love, and self-discipline." 2 Timothy 1:7 So it is with great joy and passion that we step up to serve our Lord, and it is with humble, yet spirit-led pride that we claim our rightful place as children of God.

It is also fitting that as we renew our commitment to paying down our mortgage and stewarding our building fund that the theme of our capital campaign this year is "Catch the Spirit", because this is the season of the Spirit. This is the time to remember all that God has done for us and to give thanks. This is a time to commit to the furthering of our church and its mission. And I look forward to the training we will be providing to the congregation to help us be more effective in carrying this out. So, look for those upcoming trainings and participate in them as they become available, for God has much in store for us.

Your efforts produced an inspired spirit-filled season filled with meaningful worship and good fellowship, all of which resulted in the continuing building up of our church. It is an example of being united in mission, to see so many gather together to worship, practice music, prepare meals, work on the property, organize the services, and share in the joy that belongs to the children of God. Our church has a lot of Good News to share with our community. May we continue to celebrate the Spirit of our Risen Lord in the glorious weeks to come.

### **Highlights From April 2023**

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on April 17th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$20,556 for March (YTD total is \$69,681)

Operating expenses were \$31,528 in March (YTD total is \$102,075). As of the end of March, we have a negative operating budget deficit of \$15,636. A financial update will go out once a month in the weekly email. Once a quarter, we will offer an opportunity to meet with Council after service to ask any questions.

Pastor's report: Pastor Tim reported we had more than expected at the mid-week services. We also had a great turnout for Easter with around 200 for both services and 100 at breakfast. Christian Education reported Sunday School will end for the school year on May 7th and LYFE will have their year-end celebration on May 9th. The survey sent out showed most people prefer a few Sunday activities over the summer versus a VBS. These will be for all ages and combined with a fellowship focus. **CUFF** will be hosting the backpack blessing, Kona Ice Truck and cookout on Sunday, August 27th. More details to follow. Growth encouraged members to attend the Buffalo Grove Pride Parade on June 4th after church services. In the past, we have walked in the parade but we are taking a year off because it falls on the same day as Music

Sunday/Mike Duffy's retirement celebration. Human Needs will be hosting an AED refresher course on Sunday, April 30th. We are wrapping up donations for the Housewarming Kits. Property is waiting to hear about the timing of the soffit repairs. The faucets in the back bathrooms have to be replaced due to severe corrosion. Technology found someone to help with updating the sound component for live streaming. Worship and Music reported that Easter services went well with special music from the Brass, Adult Choir, Bell Choir and LYFE. We are always looking for new people to be assistants, ushers and greeters. Old Business: 2026 Capital Campaign packets will go out this Sunday, April 23rd. 60th Anniversary celebration will take place after service on May 21st. We are still working on all the repairs from the lightning strike. Planning continues on the narthex renovation. New **Business:** Administrative Professional Day is April 26th so be sure to let Ciara know how much we appreciate her! Next council meeting currently is scheduled for May 8, 2023, at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.

#### PRIDE PARADE June 4th at 11 a.m.


LCHS will, again, be a proud sponsor of the Buffalo Grove Pride Parade on June 4. Even

We will be reading David Foster Wallace's novella Something to do with Paying

#### Attention.

David Foster Wallace's last finished work—"the most unusual conversion experience in confessional narrative" (Judith Shulevitz, Slate). When David Foster Wallace died in 2008, he left behind a vast unfinished novel-some 1,100 pages of loose chapters, sketches, notes, and fragments-published in 2011 as The Pale King. But the unfinished King did contain a finished novella that Wallace had already considered publishing as a stand-alone volume. It is the story of a young man, a selfdescribed "wastoid," adrift in the suburban Midwest of the 1970s, whose life is changed forever by an encounter with advanced tax law. It is, as Sarah McNally writes in her preface, "not just a complete story, but the best complete example we have of Wallace's late style, where calm and poise replace the pyrotechnics of Infinite Jest and other early works."
