## A Note from Our Pastor

#### Dear Friends in Christ:

The devastating fires in California and the reports from so many who have lost their homes, and their entire communities has drawn my empathy and prayers. I try to imagine what it must be like for these survivors and how I might handle such circumstances if I were faced with such devastation.

We all have moments in our life when things may not have turned out the way we had planned, moments when we pause and contemplate, moments when we stop and simply ask, "What the heck is going on?!" We may not have all the answers when we experience times like these, and it can be difficult to know where to turn. But that's when it's wise to learn from others. The author of a number of books that have helped many through those uncertain times, Elisabeth Kubler-Ross, described a situation in her own life when she had such an experience, she wrote:

"Over the years, I have learned that every life circumstance, even a crisis, can nourish your soul. Recently, the farm and home that I have loved so much for so many years burned down in a horrible fire. Everything that I owned, without exception, was lost. There was even speculation that foul play was involved.

At moments like this, we stand at a fork in the road. If we take the fork most commonly traveled, we collapse, we give up, feeling hopeless and defeated. We focus on the negatives, losing ourselves in the "problem." We point to our unhappy circumstances to rationalize our negative feelings. This is the easy way out. It takes, after all, very little effort to feel victimized.

We can, however, take the other fork. We can view the unhappy experience as an opportunity for a new beginning. We can keep our perspective, look for the growth opportunities, and find an inner reservoir of strength."

And that inner reservoir of strength comes from our creator, who never abandons us, who see us through all our challenges. In the words of Holy Scripture we hear countless believers witnessing to it.

Isaiah writes: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past.

See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." (Isaiah 43:18-19)

Paul writes: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old is gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Peter writes: "Praise be to God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." (Peter 1:3)

And again from Isaiah: "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31)

We all have moments in our life when things may not have turned out as we planned, and we stand at a fork in the road. In those moments, draw strength from God, for God is committed to making all things new. You see our God is a God of resurrection and new life, and God wants us to soar and not grow weary. So place your trust in the one who loves you more than you could ever even love yourself, and let God be your guide. One day we'll look back and see the how the hand of God was at work in the midst of everything.

#### <u>EMAIL & TEXT SCAM ALERT</u> –

Some of you received a text message from Pastor Tim last week. The text was **NOT** from Pastor Tim, but rather a scammer. Many reached out to the church office immediately and Ciara was able to send an email to all of our members alerting them of the fraudulent text.

The Village Church of Lincolnshire, also reached out last week to share information about an upcoming workshop about email and text scams. This past November, one of their own senior members was scammed out of a significant amount of money. This prompted them to organize a workshop to address the growing need for awareness and education in our community. They are partnering with the Police Department, Fire Department, local retirement communities, and potentially the State's Attorney's Office, as well as the local Library to create a workshop that equips seniors and their families with tools to prevent similar situations in the future. Everyone is at risk and no one should feel ashamed for falling victim.

### JANUARY 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on January 13th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$33,345 (YTD \$406,454). Operating expenses were \$43,141 (YTD \$444,906).

- **Pastor's Report**: Christmas Eve services went well. The 3:30 service had double the attendance from last year! EXPO's will be having a chili luncheon to get everyone together again.
- **Finance**: The Finance Review Committee conducted the annual review on January 9th . All audited transactions reviewed matched and were validated. Our current CD at Chase will mature on January 16th . We will leave \$20,000 in a 3- month CD at Chase to keep our accounts at the appropriate level to avoid fees. The rest will be transferred to the Schwab Money Market account in either another CD or left in the Money market account depending on the best interest rate.
- Christian Education: Sunday School and Tuesday LYFE resumed this week.
- **Fellowship**: 41 people attended the trivia night! Our next event will be the British Wine Butler on February 22 nd . Join us for a night of tasting wines and cheeses.
- **Property**: A new two-year electricity contract was signed, and several repairs were completed by Mike Pedersen and his family.
- **Stewardship**: We received 49 pledges for a total of \$286,200. This included 13 new pledges, and 22 members increased their pledges from last year.
- **Worship and Music**: Youth Sunday is February 9th . If any youth are interested in playing their instrument, please reach out to Nancy Fencl. Mardi Gras Sunday will be March 2nd.

**Old Business**: Please fill out the Time and Talent sheets. A task force has been assembled to gather information and bids for redoing the sanctuary floor.

**New Business**: We are still looking for a Council Member for Stewardship.

**Next council meeting is scheduled for February 10th at 7PM.** All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the church gathering place.


