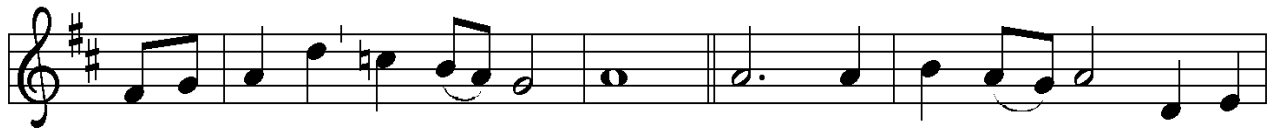

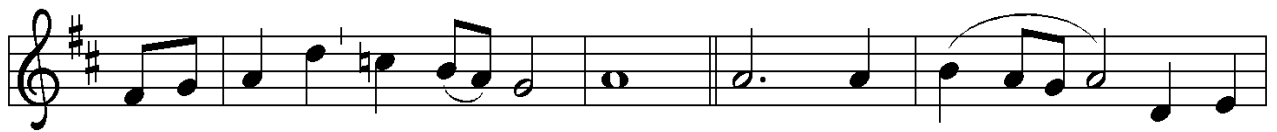

1 Corinthians 13:1-13

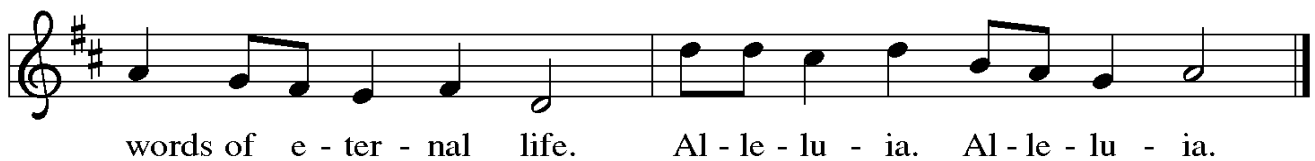
¹ If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ² And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

EMAIL & TEXT SCAM ALERT — Some of you received a text message from Pastor Tim last week. The text was **NOT** from Pastor Tim, but rather a scammer. Many reached out to the church office immediately and Ciara was able to send an email to all of our members alerting them of the fraudulent text.

The Village Church of Lincolnshire, also reached out last week to share information about an upcoming workshop they are organizing to address the growing need for awareness and education surrounding these scam attempts targeting our community. They are partnering with the Police Department, Fire Department, local retirement communities, and potentially the State's Attorney's Office, as well as the local Library to create a workshop that equips seniors and their families with tools to prevent falling victims to scammers. Everyone is at risk and no one should feel ashamed for falling victim. We will update you with specific details, in the meantime here is what we know so far:
