A Note from Our Pastor

Dear friends in Christ,

At our recent council meeting we were talking about our mission statement and the difference between an organization's mission and its purpose. Our purpose is never accomplished, it is a guiding direction, it's something that continues to be desired forever, like loving your neighbor or making disciples. And most church's mission statements are actually purpose statements, because they direct us in a way to live our life as a Christian or as a member of a church, and the purpose never ends. But mission is actually different, because a mission can be accomplished in a specific amount of time. A mission is more tangible and specific and even though different churches may agree on a general purpose, they may have very different missions.

As we work to develop more specificity in our church's mission this summer, I was reminded of a trip that Maria and I made to Florida some years ago, and during our trip we visited the Kennedy Space Center in Florida not that long ago. I remember how we thought we'd just visit for a couple hours, but ended up spending the whole day there and were captured by the various exhibits.

I have always thought that the challenge President Kennedy made to our country to land a person on the moon within the decade of the 1960's was one of our country's greatest accomplishments. To set such a lofty, seemingly unattainable goal, and then accomplish it by having tens of thousands of people working together toward this common mission was truly remarkable. And Maria and I were able to re-live the excitement of these events through re-enactments of the Apollo missions to the moon. It was an incredible experience for me, and to this day I can't help but feel very proud of our people and the United States of America.

As a pastor, I also couldn't help but think of the Church, and the many Bible references to the body of Christ, with each member doing its part to work together to promote God's mission for the world. And I imagined what the Church could do if we were as focused and dedicated to accomplishing a common mission as those at NASA were during the space race.

While at the Kennedy Space Center we also were entertained in an IMAX theater where we saw shows about the Hubbell telescope and the International Space Station. It was inspiring to see astronauts and engineers and technicians from all over the world, working together to build and expand the International Space Station. Once again, an

example of common mission where a person's nation or race or gender or age, made no difference, as people worked together to support and assist each other, and where everyone's unique gifts were appreciated and necessary to accomplish the common mission. And to see the Russians and Americans working together on this project, when for so much of our lives these two nations have been bitter enemies, and in a cold war that threatened the very life of our planet, to see that was so incredibly promising for all of humanity.



The astronauts commented that from up in space the world is so beautiful. And from space there are no boundaries that divide nations from each other. From space it's easier to see how the whole world is connected, and how vital it is for everyone to work together. Perhaps when

we get out of our own self-made view of the world we can begin to see the world as God intended, to see the world as God sees the world. And perhaps then we can see the world as a beautiful, miraculous place, a living community created from love of God, that requires that we live in that love, and that we share with and care for one another.

I pray that we might all get the opportunity to see the world in a different light and that we might all take the opportunity to reflect on what God may be calling us to do, and what life-changing mission we might become a part of. We never know when God might reveal something new to us or what great new adventure God may be calling us to.



one is a lot longer than the last but a much quicker read.


Jonathan Franzen's novels are celebrated for their unforgettably vivid characters and for their keen-eyed take on contemporary America. Now, in *Crossroads*, Franzen ventures back into the past and explores the history of two generations. With characteristic humor and complexity, and with even greater warmth, he conjures a world that resonates powerfully with our own. A tour de force of interwoven perspectives and sustained suspense, its action largely unfolding on a single winter day, *Crossroads* is the story of a Midwestern family at a pivotal moment of moral crisis.

It's December 23, 1971, and heavy weather is forecast for Chicago. Russ Hildebrandt, the associate pastor of a liberal suburban church, is on the brink of breaking free of a marriage he finds joyless unless his wife, Marion, who has her own secret life, beats him to it. Their eldest child, Clem, is coming home from college on fire with moral absolutism, having taken an action that will shatter his father. Clem's sister, Becky, long the social queen of her high-school class, has sharply veered into the counterculture, while their brilliant younger brother Perry, who's been selling

drugs to seventh graders, has resolved to be a better person. Each of the Hildebrandts seeks a freedom that each of the others threatens to complicate.

Jonathan Franzen's gift for melding the small picture and the big picture has never been more dazzlingly evident. than in Crossroads.

Highlights From June 2023

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on May 8th. **Treasurer's report** included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$43,309 for April (YTD total is \$129,748) Operating expenses were \$46,184 in March (YTD total is \$148,259). As of the end of April, we have a negative operating budget deficit of \$18,511. We will send out updated giving statements. We haven't sent any benevolence to the Synod due to our current financial situation.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Tim reported it has been a busy month. We kicked off the Capital Campaign, Confirmation, choir director interviews and hosting the North Conference meeting. We still need one more delegate to the Synod Assembly. Christian Education reported Sunday School will end for the school year on May 21st. LYFE will end on May 9th. They will host two evening summer family events so stay tuned for more details. Growth encouraged members to attend sign up for the D103 Run on Saturday, May 20th and attend the Buffalo Grove Pride parade after services on June 4th. **Human Needs** will be passing around an interest sheet to see if we have enough interest for a blood drive in the

fall. We also need volunteers for the Lutheran Day Nursery visit on June 15th. **Property** reported the faucets in the west end will be replaced. Corcoran Heating has submitted a \$7342 proposal to replace Air Conditioning Unit #5. A proposal was received from Barreca Blacktop to sealcoat the parking lot for \$3538 which is \$380 more than the amount they charged in 2021. Technology is working on livestreaming to YouTube and Facebook simultaneously. Worship and Music will be conducting a second interview this week with a candidate for the Choir Director position. Old Business: 2026 Capital Campaign is underway! Commitments are due this Sunday! 60th Anniversary celebration will take place after service on May 21st. Planning continues for the narthex renovation. **New Business**: A committee was started to begin looking into the 2024 lease for LCNS. We will also start updating the church directory. Next council meeting currently is scheduled for June 12, 2023, at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.

IRS Payroll Tax Refund

The church council is pleased to share news that Holy Spirit has received a refund of over \$25,000 from the IRS as part of the Employee Retention Credit program. The ERC offers refunds to organizations like Holy Spirit that continued to pay our employees during the pandemic despite a significant decline in receipts during 2020 and 2021. Special thanks to Daaron Dohler, Joe Labellarte, and former member Carol Greenhut for identifying this opportunity and submitting the IRS paperwork to secure this refund.
